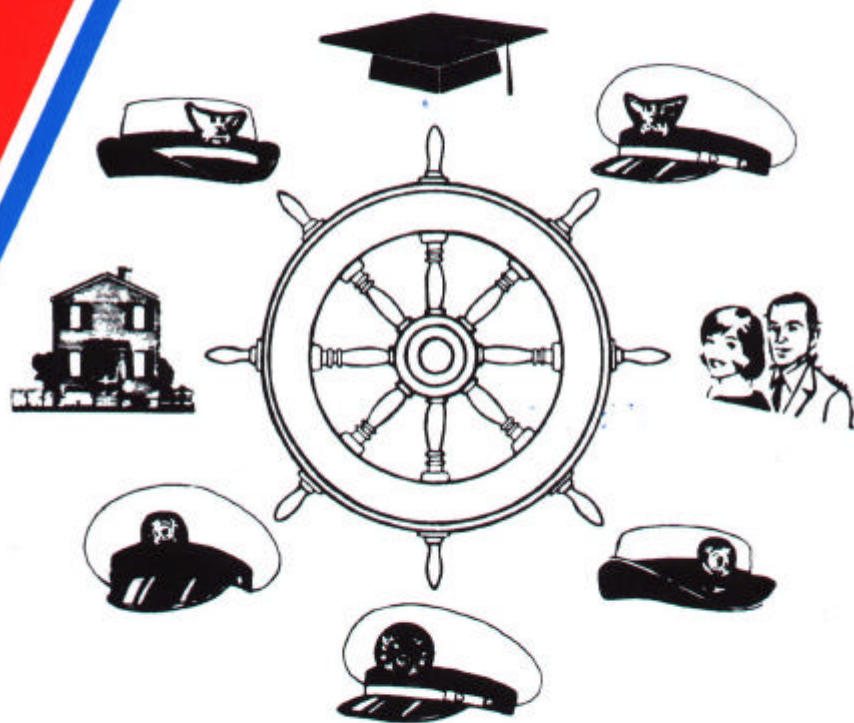

Message from the President



Dear Members,

Coast Guard Mutual Assistance (CGMA) continues its fine performance as a Premiere Relief Society. Tremendous changes in the past few years have made CGMA highly efficient and effective in meeting the needs of our members.

As this report attests, the need for CGMA continues stronger than ever. A record amount of assistance was provided to our members during 2000. For the first time in the organization's history, in a single year:

- Over 10,000 loans and grants were issued.
- Total assistance broke the \$7 million level.
- More than \$1 million in grants were provided.

While CGMA continues to adjust programs to meet the changing needs of members from all segments of the Coast Guard family, in the past few years, assistance has outpaced revenues. We are witnessing a dramatic increase in appeals for assistance across the board. At the same time, the recent decline in the stock market caused a significant drop in investment revenues. The overall effect has been a decrease in the organization's net worth, prompting recent steps to boost investment income, increase member contributions, and consider adjusting non-critical assistance programs.

I thank the Board of Control, Regional Directors, Representatives, and everyone who has supported CGMA throughout the years. Keep up the good work! Now, more than ever, CGMA needs your dedication and support so that we can continue to take care of our own.

Coast Guard Mutual Assistance

Originally established in 1924 as *The League of Coast Guard Women*, Coast Guard Mutual Assistance (CGMA) has a long history of providing short-term financial aid to the men and women of the United States Coast Guard. Today, Coast Guard Mutual Assistance offers financial assistance to the entire Coast Guard family; Active Duty and Retired military personnel, Civilian employees, Reservists, Auxiliarists, Commissioned officers of the Public Health Service serving with the Coast Guard, and their families.

Mutual Assistance is administered by the Board of Control at Coast Guard Headquarters in Washington, D.C., by Regional Directors in various CGMA regions throughout the country, and by Representatives at selected duty stations. In most cases, people who need assistance submit their requests to a Representative. CGMA funds come solely from the contributions of Coast Guard personnel and other individuals, and from revenues derived from investment of accrued capital.

Coast Guard Mutual Assistance offers its members various services under each of the programs, including loans, grants, financial counseling, and referral to other sources. The goal of CGMA is to treat each individual needing help with sensitivity and understanding and to be as responsive as possible to the needs of eligible Mutual Assistance applicants.

Coast Guard Mutual Assistance helps thousands of members each year obtain loans through its six programs. In consequence, Mutual Assistance has a keen awareness of the important role loans play in assisting members to meet their financial needs. At the same time, Mutual Assistance understands the pitfalls that await members who become overburdened with debt and find repayment a hardship. Because of this, we urge members not to borrow any more than is absolutely necessary. Mutual Assistance loans should be used to supplement, not take the place of other available assistance, such as parental and family aid, financial counseling, and state and federal programs. Used responsibly, loans can be tremendously helpful. Used irresponsibly, they can become an overwhelming burden.

Eligibility

Except for restricted members, everyone associated with the Coast Guard is eligible to receive assistance from CGMA. Active Duty and Retired military personnel; Civilian and CGES employees; Reservists; Auxiliarists; Commissioned Officers of the Public Health Service serving with the Coast Guard; and their families, are all eligible to receive assistance from CGMA. Additionally, CGMA has reciprocal agreements with the Air Force Aid Society, Army Emergency Relief, Navy-Marine Corps Relief Society and the American Red Cross that allows Coast Guard members to receive emergency assistance from these organizations when CGMA is not available.

Assistance is provided to members through six programs. Each program is designed to meet the unique circumstances faced by individuals from each segment of the Coast Guard family; therefore, certain CGMA programs are available to a limited portion of the Coast Guard family. However, 73% of all assistance provided by CGMA falls under the Emergency Loan, General Assistance and Education Assistance Programs. Virtually all Coast Guard members and employees are entitled to receive assistance under these three programs.

Programs

This list briefly describes the six programs. The Coast Guard Mutual Assistance Manual contains detailed information concerning eligibility requirements and procedures to obtain assistance.

EMERGENCY LOAN PROGRAM

One of the main purposes of Coast Guard Mutual Assistance is to provide financial assistance to members caught in emergency, short-term, financial situations beyond their control. Emergency loans are generally authorized in circumstances that impose a serious financial or personal hardship on the member requiring urgent help to relieve the situation.

GENERAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

General Assistance may be provided when unexpected events or expenses cause a serious financial burden and financial need is demonstrated. General Assistance differs from the Emergency Loan program because the qualifying circumstances do not immediately endanger personal well-being or require urgent help.

EDUCATION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Coast Guard Mutual Assistance has developed several programs to help members and their families financially meet their educational goals. Education assistance is available through several CGMA education programs:

- ◆ Education Grant Program.
- ◆ Supplemental Education Grant (SEG) Program.
- ◆ Federal Student Loan Program.
- ◆ Supplemental Student Loan Program.
- ◆ Vocational and Technical Training (VoTech) Student Loan Program.

HOUSING ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

The Housing Assistance Program helps Coast Guard service members and their families obtain housing. Regional Directors are authorized to assist eligible personnel in the purchase of a home through loans for closing commitments. Rental Assistance is authorized to assist eligible personnel with security deposits and utilities. Housing assistance is intended to assist service members and

their families in obtaining housing as the result of permanent change of station orders.

MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Medical expenses beyond TRICARE and supplemental insurance can sometimes be very costly to our members. In most cases medical treatment is of an emergency nature and not normally anticipated in a member's budget. When a provider demands prepayment for services, or the cost of receiving necessary medical and dental treatment places an unexpected financial hardship on a member, the member may apply for a CGMA loan. This program does not relieve our members from having the proper supplementary medical and dental insurance in place.

DEBT MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

The purpose of the Debt Management Program (DMP) is to assist our members in becoming good financial managers of their income. To become good financial managers, they must first be able to meet their financial obligations. CGMA is willing to become a partner with the member by giving the minimum financial assistance needed to allow the member to enter a DMP with Consumer Credit Counseling Service (CCCS) or a similar program through another debt/credit management agency. Sacrifice and austerity on the part of members are essential. The DMP does not aim to return an insolvent person to an absolutely normal way of life. Instead, it creates the minimum essential financial condition that will allow the person to live while paying off obligations in a responsible manner. The DMP generates sufficient cash flow to permit a livable budget, repayment of debt, and the provision for modest savings to meet future needs.

Contributions

Coast Guard Mutual Assistance receives no funds from the federal government. CGMA is supported by voluntary contributions from our members solicited during the annual fund raising campaign. Contributions are also accepted at any time from individuals or organizations. Contributions can be made in the form of cash, check, charge card, or allotment contributions (when authorized). Contributions can also be made in the form of memorial contributions, as bequests from individuals or estates, or as special donations.

Contributions to CGMA are tax deductible under section 170(b)(1)(a) of the Internal Revenue Code. CGMA is tax exempt under section 501(c)(3) of the Code.

2000 Highlights

This was the busiest year in Coast Guard Mutual Assistance history. CGMA members received over 10,100 loans and grants totaling \$7.3 million in assistance. In the past five years Coast Guard Mutual Assistance has provided almost \$30 million in assistance. Since 1990, over \$57 million in assistance has been provided to members of the Coast Guard Family. It is clear that the need for Coast Guard Mutual Assistance continues and that Coast Guard Mutual Assistance has again demonstrated that we can meet the needs of our members!

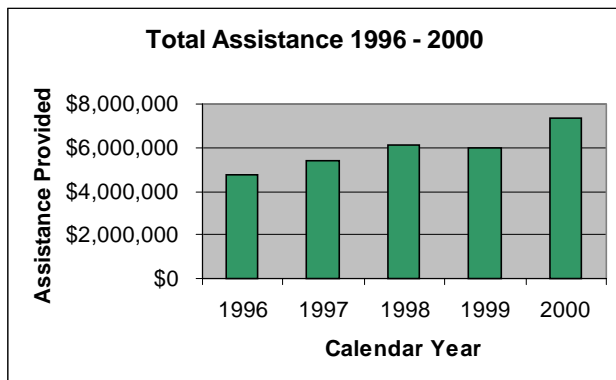

Other Assistance

In addition to assistance provided directly to our members, Coast Guard Mutual Assistance helps its members by paying fees on their behalf so they may obtain assistance from other programs. In 2000 Coast Guard Mutual Assistance guaranteed Federal Student Loans (Stafford Loans) and PLUS Loans totaling \$376,769. By paying the fees associated with these loans, Coast Guard Mutual Assistance helped our members save \$11,303 in guarantee and origination fees. Coast Guard Mutual Assistance also paid \$3,254 for members needing services provided by Consumer Credit Counseling Service. Additionally, \$28,666 in outstanding loans were converted into grants during 2000.

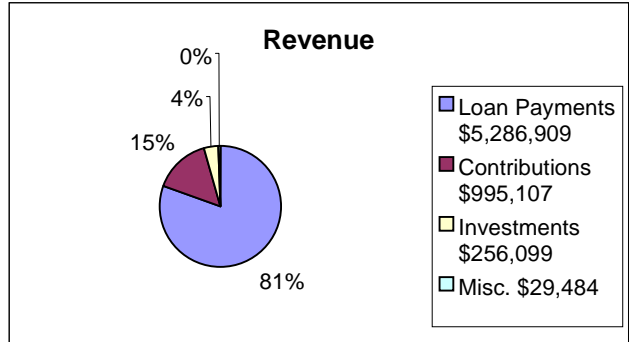

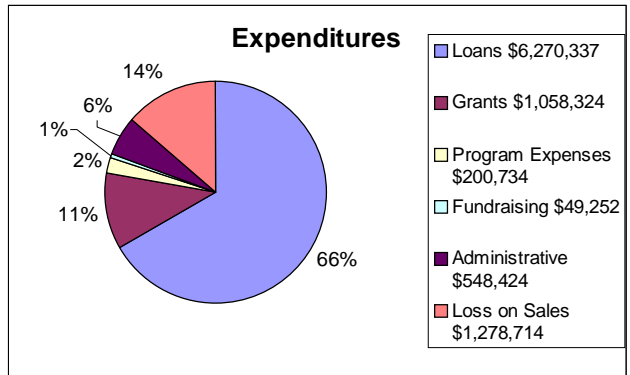
